From Kathy Potter...Our next **ROMANS event is Sunday, March 10** right after worship! Our project that day will be assembling kits that will then be delivered to **The Clean Love Project** based out of Romulus. From their website: The Clean Love Project (TCLP) launched in 2015 with the mission to help women and young girls feel clean, loved, and empowered. TCLP distributes kits containing essentials - including feminine hygiene projects - to those who need them most. Kits are delivered to homeless & women's shelters, transitional housing programs, food pantries & school districts. To date, TCLP has distributed more than 40,000 kits. The Clean Love Project was highly recommended to us by Steve Boyak, friend of St. Paul's & son of Arnie & Doris Boyak. Steve's home congregation has been supporting this organization for a while. Part of the mission is to collect the items needed to supply the kits over the next 5 weeks! So, we are requesting donations of the following items. Our goal is 80 kits. If we receive more, we will assemble more! **Please consider donating items or, if you prefer, funds** (so that the Faith Formation Committee can purchase additional items not donated). **Please make your donations by Monday, March 4th** so that we will know how much we will need to fill in. Numbers indicated next to items are the total number we will need to complete our goal of 80 kits. **Individually wrapped toothbrushes (80); Travel sized toothpaste (80); Deodorant, neutral or women's (80); New socks (80 pair); Travel size Flushable Wipes packs (80); Tampons, individually wrapped (800); Sanitary napkins, individually wrapped (400). Each kit must include the above & are priority.** Other items, listed here, are welcome, but not essential. Lip balm, travel size soaps, combs, bandages, hair ties, tissues.

There will be a box in the front lobby in which to place donated items.

We will assemble the kits on March 10th following lunch!
